## Editorial

### Family Matters

Today's Tripura Dream has a Rubber segment inbuilt into it. For a family in present day Tripura, few things seem more desirable than the prospect of owning a rubber garden. Interestingly, when rubber cultivation was first introduced in the state, most people looked askance at the leaf-fringed wonder, hardly realizing the revolution it was about to usher in not only in the economy of the state, but also in the psyche of its people. The impatience many displayed at having to wait out the first seven unproductive years vanished only when the rubber-rich began to flaunt it. And it didn't take the cynic long to lap up the rubber idea with a rare abandon.

The ambivalence about rubber has now vanished. More and more hectares of land are turning into rubber garden every passing year. One can sense a growing belief among the ordinary man that rubber is the panacea for all ills.

That's contestable, for sure. In fact, there are a number of myths surrounding the rubber phenomenon, each of which merit closer analysis and more-informed discourse. Take for instance, the falsity of the widespread belief that rubber has made the tribal society of Tripura rich. In fact, it has made only a microscopic segment of the tribal society rich, and stinking rich, that is.

Nevertheless, the rubber phenomenon has affected everyone in the community, both the rubber-haves and rubber-have-nots. For the latter it is the El Dorado devoutly wished, and for the former, it's a hugely gratifying indication of having moved up into the class that counts.

As a diocese, we focus on 'Families' in a special way this year. We cannot fail to consider the dynamics that rubber seems to be bringing into our homes and hearths. The suddenness of the rubber magic often gives rise to a 'big money syndrome' that not only redefines family's priorities and value system, but desecrates its natural sanctity and warmth.

With the god Mammon demanding from its devotees every bit of their strength, time and devotion one neither has time nor interest in responding to invitations of any other nature. It's an oft-heard alibi: "I have bought an estate and must attend to it. Excuse me." (Lk 14,18). It's never simply about hectares of land or liters of latex, really.

Youth need constant encouragement and guidance. Little guidance and

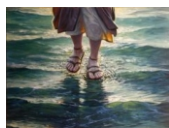

### Parishioners walk on the Water...like Jesus

St. Alphonsa parishioners conceived the idea of sharing the word of God



to a new village called Champapara. The village is interior on hillocks inhabited by Rupini tribe. The village has 35 to 40 families. The villagers are poor and miserable economically. The parishioners purchased 40 blankets and other warm clothes to protect them from cold as a goodwill gesture. They also carried rice, daal, eggs and other food items. The route was unknown. Everyone was surprised to learn, the only route leading to the village was to follow a winding river upward called Champa. The villagers have no other approach road than the river. It was an exodus scene on the river carrying blankets, warm clothes and food items. The village could be traced amidst forests and hillocks after walking on the water-route about an hour. The villagers gathered on a courtyard and waited eagerly to hear the Word of God; then blankets, food and clothing were distributed. It was hard to walk on the water (requires strong faith and will power) but hard to forget the smiles on the face of the villagers.

**Mother Teresa musical to tour India**

**Is Sri Lanka Pope Francis's first Asian destination?**

Pope Francis is expected to visit Sri Lanka

in the first half of this year to open South Asia's largest university for theological studies. The island nation will become the first destination in Asia for Pope Francis, who took over the mantle from Pope Benedict XVI on March 13, 2013. The Pope has accepted an invitation from Cardinal Malcolm Ranjith, archbishop of Colombo and head of the Catholic Church Sri Lanka, Church sources said. The University for Theological Studies has been constructed in Bolawalana, Negombo, near Colombo, the national capital. The new University is considered the largest of its kind in South Asia. Pope Francis is also expected to visit neighboring India in December to attend the decennial exposition of St Francis Xavier's relics kept in Bom Jesu Church in Old Goa.
