Satellites of Hope

Pope Francis has spoken of hope so often during his pontificate that we could call him a Pontiff of Hope. And

now, the Holy See has found a great way to share Pope Francis' words of hope to the world. *Catholic News Agency* reported that on March 29, Pope Francis blessed a satellite that will launch his words into space on June 10. The "Spes Satelles," Latin for "Satellites

of Hope," will be launched on a rocket taking off from the Vandenberg Space Force Base in California. According to the Vatican, the miniaturized satellite will hold a copy of a book documenting the Pope's *urbi et orbi* blessing of March 27, 2020, when, in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, he blessed the world from St. Peter's Square with the words "Lord, may you bless the world, give health to our bodies, and comfort our hearts." "You ask us not to be afraid," the Pope had prayed. "Yet our faith is weak and we are fearful. But you, Lord, will not leave us at the

mercy of the storm."

A press release stated that the satellite is equipped

with a radio transmitter as well as onboard instruments to be maneuvered from the ground. While in orbit, the satellite will broadcast decipherable statements from Pope Francis on the theme of hope and peace in English, Italian, and Spanish. The President of the Italian Space Agency, Giorgio Saccoccia, said the Holy See asked the agency

to identify a way for Pope Francis' words of hope "to cross the earth's borders and reach from space the greatest possible number of women and men on our troubled planet."

On 5 June, we celebrate World Environment Day. In our Diocese we celebrate the day as <u>Green Sunday</u>, a small initiative of planting trees, which I started six years ago, to promote a greener environment. This year we will celebrate the Green Sunday on <u>11th June</u> in all our Parishes across the Diocese, with the slogan PLANT A TREE. +Lumen, CSC

Training on Promotion of Farmer to Farmer's Knowledge Exchange Program on Agriculture

The program has also helped the farmers to become aware to protect local biodiversity, promote cultural identity, and improve the resilience of local communities to climate change. The program also includes documentation which can help to ensure that this knowledge is preserved for future generations and can be used to inform policy and research in these areas. Caritas Internationalis elects a new President



The 22nd General Assembly of Caritas Internationalis elected Archbishop Tarcisio Isao Kikuchi as its new President. Archbishop Tarcisius Isao Kikuchi, SVD, the Archbishop of Tokyo, in Japan, was elected as the 13th President of Caritas Internationalis. He will serve a four-year term at the

head of the Confederation of 162 Catholic relief, development and social service organizations. Caritas operates in over 200 countries and territories around the world, and seeks to build a better world, especially for the poor and oppressed. Archbishop Kikuchi also serves as President of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of Japan and Secretary General of the Federation of Asian Bishops' Conferences (FABC). He served as the President of Caritas Japan from 2007 to 2022. He was also the President of Caritas Asia from 2011 to 2019, a member of the Caritas Internationalis Executive Committee from 1999 to 2004, and a member of the Representative Council from 2011 to 2019. In his address to Caritas members, Archbishop Kikuchi said, "Caritas must be in the front line to receive, accompany, serve and defend the poor and vulnerable..." He has served as Archbishop of Tokyo since his appointment in 2017, prior to which he had served as the Bishop of Niigata since 2004.
