The Good Shepherd who cares for our every need

Every once in a while, a ewe will give

birth to a lamb and reject it. There are many reasons why she may do this. If

the lamb is returned to the ewe, the mother may even kick the poor animal away. Once a ewe rejects one of her lambs, she will never change her mind. These little lambs will hang their heads so low that it looks like something is wrong with its neck.

Their spirit is broken. These lambs are called "bummer lambs." Unless the shepherd intervenes, that lamb will die, rejected and alone. So, do you know what the shepherd does? He takes that rejected little one into his home, hand-feeds it and keep it warm by the fire. He will wrap it up with blankets and hold it to his chest so the bummer can hear his heartbeat. Once the lamb is strong enough, the shepherd will place it back in the field with the rest of the flock. But that sheep never forgets how the shepherd cared for him when his mother rejected him. When the shepherd calls for the flock, guess who runs to him first? That is right, the

bummer sheep. He knows his voice intimately. It is

not that the bummer lamb is loved more, it just knows intimately the one who loves it. It's not that it is loved more, it just believes it because it has experienced that love one on one.

So many of us are bummer lambs, rejected and broken. But God is the good Shepherd who cares for our every need and holds us close to His heart so we

can hear His heart beat. We may be broken but we are deeply loved by the Shepherd. If we experience God in this way then we will be like John, the tall and robust milkman, who loves his work. The gleam in his eyes tells everyone that he loves his work and everyone is always glad to see him. The secret of his happiness is this. Although he is very poor, he finds inexpressible joy in this thought, "God is within me. He looks after me in my work, and gives me strength to do it, and this is the reason why I am so happy. EDITORIAL

The spacious grounds of Khumpui Academy at Khumulwng, will witness a

gathering markedly different from the one it is generally

used to when the Annual Eucharistic Procession will converge in its precincts two weeks hence. The grounds, seasoned by political rallies of all hues, shades, and decibels, and even the occasional orchestra once so popular, lends itself well to this year's edition of what is undoubtedly the biggest annual gathering of Catholics in the State.

The choice of venue displays some innovative thinking on the part of the Catholic Laity of Tripura which has been organizing the Procession year after year for the past 13 years almost uninterruptedly. The relatively quieter ambience of Khumulwng, one hopes, will help to make it a truly spiritual



experience.

The Procession has, over the years, trudged along experimental paths and each time emerged better for



the exercise. Today it is just about the only annual event that brings together a sizeable number of believers at a Diocesan level. Rail connectivity reaching Agartala and Sabroom has benefitted the Procession, no doubt, but it has also made it a trifle time-conscious. Participants from faraway Parishes might be little anxious about catching the return train, but they do not show that for sure. In fact, the

devotion with which the people take part in the programs – be it the Mass, or the Adoration, has always been edifying and inspiring even to the causal onlooker.

No doubt, the Eucharistic Procession forges an identity of sorts that is unique. The procession provides a platform for all Catholics to rally around
