Soon we will be celebrating the greatest feast in the Catholic Church the Resurrection of Jesus


from the dead. Easter is preceded with *Triduum* which begins with Holy Thursday. On that day we commemorate the Last Supper which reminds us of 'servant leadership' "wash each other's feet" (Jn.13,15) and 'agape love'.

Agape is unconditional and everlasting love. It is unconditional love, bigger than ourselves; a boundless compassion, and an infinite empathy. It is the purest form of love that is free from desires and expectations, and love regardless of the flaws and shortcomings of others. Agape is the love that accepts, forgives and believes in the greatest good of the other. Loving one another is the

criterion of mutual love. It means that mutual love is totally selfless and selfgiving: one's love is, as it were, deposited in the other and this is done by both, in total trust and selfgift to the other.

Agape Love is always altruistic, other-centered and not self-centered. It is a self-giving and self-sacrificing love; love, which is not just a feeling, a thought, a sensation or an emotion. Love is expressed not in words but in action for Love is an action, a verb, and not a noun. When one says, 'I love you', s/he keeps the other person in first place. The focus here is not 'I' but 'You'. It means I love you more than I love myself. If you love someone, then do something in action for that person; do something that costs you something. As St. Mother Teresa used to say, "Give till it hurts". Agape love is the love that wills and does the absolute good of the other. This love is

sacrificial love. And so Love is **not** being spelt as LOVE **but** as SACRIFICE.

In search of our Songs



Kokborok liturgy seldom seems to avail of that 'extra something' which good singing is said to

add to liturgy. And the reasons are not hard to identify. Take a look at *Logesong*, the official hymnal cum prayer book of the Diocese. Most of the hymns it contains are average, with very little to recommend. This is not to decry the presence of some outstanding hymns in *Logesong* that have an enduring appeal and have borne the weight of repeated singing for decades. The majority of Kokborok hymns therein, however, seem to suffer from poor 'form'- the melodic range and contour, harmony, rhythm and tempo and 'substance' the meaning of the lyrics and their relevance. In special times like Lent and Holy

Week, we become more aware of this lacuna. Our hymns seem incapable of capturing and expressing all that we feel within; they are, at best, well-intentioned but ill-conceived machinations that fail to lift us to higher realms. When our hearts want to race, they trudge along, merely.

By stating this, I do not mean to blame those that have in the past, under many constraints, done what they could. However imperfect their contributions, they have left indelible marks on our liturgy and life.

It is time we paid greater attention to hymns. Some input to musicians on what makes liturgical music work, perhaps; some encouragement and support so that they are enthused to employ their gifts for religious music, perhaps. Does 'better hymns, life-changing hymns' merely mean better rhythm, better melody and better lyrics? One is inclined to think they are, rather, the result of an emotional

engagement with God in the depths of one's heart. Like David did with his harp, it is time our musicians took up their instruments and began to 'sing to the Lord a new song' (Ps 96:1). **J. Pulinthanath, SDB**

AMBASSA PARISH

Missionary Childhood Day

Holy Spirit Ambassa Parish Pastoral Council decided to celebrate the Childhood Day through Medical Camps and distributing clothes to the poor children in the Villages. Hence on February 17th and 24th the Parish Team along with a medical Doctor and Nurses organized two Camps in Shikari Bari and Bodo Bari. Shikari Bari is situated 15 kilometers from Ambassa and is inhabited by Noatia tribal community. This hamlet is easily reachable from the National Highway; yet the poverty and illiteracy prevalent there is dominantly noticed. We could attend to 86 Patients with different diseases. There were cases of Malaria P.F, Malnutrition of children and mothers, Tuberculosis, and so on. People have to walk for almost two kilometers to fetch water. The Government administered Primary School hardly functions.

Again on 24th February the Parish Team organized a Camp in Bodo Bari. It is a Molsom dominated tribal village around 6 Kms from Ambassa. We could attend to more than 100 Patients, mostly children and women. Though the village is not far away from the District Offices, yet development has not taken place. Poor road communication, no water supply, no electricity, etc, are their woes. Thanks to the Parish Council Members for their decision and commitment. *Ivan D'Silva, SVD*

Training for School Peace Club Leaders Women's



JUST organized a training for School Peace Club leaders on "Drugs Abuse and Human Trafficking" at JUST Hall Agartala on 18th February. There were 44 Peace Club leaders from 8 Schools who participated in the training. The Resource Person was Mr. Sushant Chopra from Mumbai, Youth with a Mission (YWAM) Organization. The Resource Person shared the differences of Drugs Misuse and Abuse. He also shared a note on Alcohol Abuse, its causes, and measures to overcome it. Later he showed a short video clip and spoke of three most common types of human trafficking-- sex trafficking, forced labour, and debt bondage. He explained the 13 SIGNS of human trafficking through a short video clip and another clip on "good touch and bad touch" making the participants aware and raise their voice when they come across such type of harassment. The participants were then divided into and were asked to write down what they have learned from the training and to make an Action Plan.

collaboration with the Diocese of Rottenburg.
