After cleaning his father's hands the young man stood in silence and began to tidy and clean up the workshop. That night, father and son talked for a long time. The next morning, the young man went to the office of the director. The director noticed the tears in the eyes of the young man when he asked him to share what he learned yesterday at home. JUST received 17,820 LONG LASTING INSECTICIDAL NETS (LLIN) from the Govt. of Tripura under the program Intensified Malaria Control Project-II for distribution in the project areas. 14,100 is the amount to be distributed in Dhalai District and 3,720 in Khowai District of Tripura. 9,200 LLIN have been distributed as of now in the target villages and the remaining distribution will be done by January 2016. *Mr. Vincent Debbarma*
