The irrepressible ring in that telephone call which screams into your ear, "hello, ang chakri mankha" (I got job) is the echo of some ultimate consummation finding words.


And for the government, 'the teaching job' is just about the only 'instrument' it has in

aim of this infrastructure is to create a platform for common discussions, conduct training programs and meetings. It will also

serve as a store house of their finished products like handloom, weaving products, and other products. 10 SHGs under one cluster have taken this initiative of constructing their own infrastructure, 20 Resource Center Leaders were present for the great occasion. Fr. Paul encouraged them to go ahead in life and to stand on their own feet to improve their economic conditions.

Medical Camp: A day-long medical Camp was organized at Naisingpara on 14th July. The Resource Person of the program was Dr. Anut Debbarma, Mr. Daniel Debbarma the project manager coordinated the program. The patients suffering from different health concerns benefitted from the camp. During the camp it was observed that majority of the patients have come



with waterborne related diseases like malaria dvsenterv cough and cold.

The devastating fire which occurred three months back still continues to increase the water borne diseases to a very high degree. The camp inhabitants are found having scabies. ring warm and furanculasis (boils). The lactating and nursing mothers are found anemic. Children are affected with worm infestation and malnutrition. Global Schoolroom

Global Schoolroom is an initiative designed to help Irish Teachers share



their educational experience with their counterparts in the Developing World and vice versa. To this end, a Global Schoolroom Team

from Ireland was in Tripura from 4th July to the end of July and the Team was divided into 3 groups to conduct the course in 3 different centers. Under each center, Teachers from the following schools participated.

North Tripura - Holy Cross Panisagar, St. Arnold's Ambassa, Holy Cross Kathalcherra and 2 Feeder Schools

West Tripura - St. Andre School Bodhujungnagar and Notre Dame Moharpara

South Tripura - Holy Cross School Tuikarmaw and Holy Cross School Depacherra

This process would take place in the coming three years at the same time in the same place. After the successful completion of the courses and the assignments the teachers would be awarded a Diploma Certificate from the University of Dublin, Ireland apart from B. Ed, for which the process of affiliating this program either to the NEHU or to Don Bosco University Assam is underway.

World Youth Day concludes in Spain

Pope Benedict XVI celebrated Mass in front of a million-strong young crowd in Madrid to mark the end of the World Youth day celebrations on Aug 21.

The Pontiff announced that Rio de Janeiro in Brazil would be the venue for the 2013 World Youth Day.

"I hope you were able to sleep

despite the inclement weather," the Pope said before the mass, a fitting finale to the six-day event. "I am sure that this morning you lifted your eyes to the sky more than once, not just your eyes but also your heart," he said.



The youngsters greeted the Pope and gave him gifts from their respective regions. He

> received salt and bread from a voung Polish woman, a flower garland from a Japanese woman, a bowl of rice from a South Korean, a sombrero (a broad-brimmed hat) from a Honduran and coffee beans in a banana leaf from a young man from Australia.

The Pope greeted youths in Spanish, French, English, German, Italian, Portuguese and Polish. "World Youth Day is an opportunity to know Christ better and to make sure that, rooted in him, your enthusiasm and happiness,

vour desire to go further, to reach the heights. even God himself, always hold a sure future, because the fullness of life has already been placed within you," he said.

Meanwhile, the sheer scale of the celebrations sparked angry demonstrations at a time of economic hardship in Spain, with unemployment for under-25s in Spain running at more than 45 per cent. Thousands of protesters marched in central Madrid almost daily to protest the cost but organizers say most of the cost will be covered by a registration fee from the pilgrims and the event is a big tourist boost. Salesian Archbishop Dominic Jala of Shillong, who led the funeral Mass at the Bishop's House, Jowai, hailed the deceased prelate as a man of the people who worked for a laity-based Church.

Bilhan Kympat, the bishop's elder brother who was staying with him, said he had gone looking for the prelate when he did not turn up for lunch and found him lying unconscious in the bathroom.

The priests in the house called a doctor who advised them to shift the bishop to a nearby government hospital. The doctors there declared him dead at 3 pm. He was 64.
