Attending the National Leadership Training Program of YCS/YSM at Seva Kendra, Calcutta, was a transformative experience for me. Travelling from Agartala on October 27 morning with five students (Sahel Debbarma, Javery Hwrangkhawl, Wincy Debbarma, Mili Kaipeng&UdisDarlong) from different institutions of Agartala Diocese along with Miss Sandhya Hrangkhawl, Lady Animator YCS/YSM Agartala Diocese, we arrived the venue on October 29 at around 12:30 am. The program began on 30th of October evening with a meaningful Holy Eucharist, celebrated by Most Rev. Thomas D' Souza, Archbishop of Kolkata, followed by a welcome speech by Rev. Fr. Chetan Machado, the National Chaplain, YCS/YSM India and Mr. Anson Nazareth, the President of YCS/YSM India. The Sessions were interesting and meaningful and were based on the methodology of YCS/YSM - SEE, JUDGE and ACT. A significant highlight was our visit to the slums, where we engaged directly with the residents to understand their struggles. Enlightening experience for pilgrims from Tripura

Group of 58 visits Old Goa for veneration of St Francis Xavier's sacred relics

Old Goa: A pilgrimage group from the archdiocese of Agartala in Tripura was a part of the thousands of devotees who visited Old Goa on Thursday to witness the decennial Exposition of the sacred relics of St Francis Xavier.

Most of these devotees from the Northeast, attending the event for the first time, were left with a wholesome experience, some even kneeling down with tears in their eyes as the carriage carrying the relics was moved from the Basilica of Bom Jesus to the Se Cathedral.

The pilgrimage group comprises 58 devotees, including a priest, two nuns and people from the diocese, including a lecturer, an engineer and a doctor.

Having planned the trip six months ago, the group arrived in the state on Wednesday after travelling on a train for four days. The group will leave for Tripura on November 24.



Leading the group, Daniel Debbarma said though they were not much aware of the life and works of St Francis Xavier, they were curious, and on Thursday experienced a wholesome experience of faith.

"We did not know much of the life of St Francis Xavier and his miracles. We only know him as a holy person because of his relics, and being Catholics, we had the privilege of knowing a little about him. People were curious to know about him. This trip has turned out to be a kind of tour in honour of God," he said.

Though there were other saints like St Thomas and St Augustine, the Exposition, which is a once-in-ten-year event, was an exciting experience, he said. "People were touched; many were kneeling and had tears in their eyes when they saw the sacred relics. The moment touched their hearts and it was worth spending all the time to be here. It speaks volumes when devotees experience this sort of feeling; it brings them closer to their faith," said Debbarma, who has been to Goa in the past.

The group also expressed gratitude to organisers of the Exposition saying it was not easy to hold an event of this scale amidst many challenges. "There are many issues involved like commercialisation and other hurdles. It is not easy to sustain and promote the feeling of faith in serenity and sanctity of the saint. We can sense the struggle the organisers may have faced. Today's Goa is not the same as it used to be earlier. Modern Goa has many challenges. We want to extend our gratitude for welcoming us," said Debbarma.

He said it was necessary to encourage youth and the younger generation to carry on the legacy of the saint.

The archdiocese of Agartala comprises 25 parishes and is headed by Rev Bishop Lumen Monteiro, who hails from Goa and is the first bishop of Agartala. He was ordained as a bishop in 1996.

News Bytes from All Over

The Indian Railways network is one of the largest in the world, with lakhs of people using it for their travel. Indian Railways is also upgrading its trains and coaches and introducing new trains for the convenience of passengers. Vande Bharat Express trains are a perfect example of this. Adding to it, India Railways is now planning to introduce a groundbreaking train that requires neither diesel nor electricity to operate.

This "water-powered" train is all set to run on tracks soon. If we talk about the evolution of the Indian Railways, like other countries it all began with steam engines and then shifted to coal. Then the train engines shifted to fossil fuel power - diesel - that gives power but emulates pollution also. Modern trains run on electricity which is also generated by burning coal. Amid these advancements, a new era began with the launch of a train powered by water, marking a significant milestone for India.

For the first time in the country, the train will run on water. This will be achieved through advanced hydrogen fuel technology. This train will require about 40,000 liters of water per hour, and special water storage facilities will be built to support this operation. According to railway spokesperson Dilip Kumar, the cost for a single hydrogen train is approximately Rs 80 crore.

The hydrogen train generates electricity by converting hydrogen and oxygen through fuel cells, emitting only steam and water as byproducts, unlike diesel engines. Not only that, the high-tech train will be 60 percent quieter than diesel trains, offering same speed and passenger capacity. The train is anticipated to reach speeds of 140 km/h and cover up to 1,000 kilometers on a single run.

JUST organized youth training on local resource mobilization for a sustainable peace-building process, held at JUST Hall Damdamia on 26th October. The training session began with a minute of silence for self-reflection and prayer. Mr. G. VanneilianaDarlong, State Consultant, delivered the welcome address on behalf of JUST. He thanked the participants for their presence and highlighted the organization's commitment to skill development and resource mobilization for sustainable peacebuilding process.

The session highlighted by Mr. Robert Lushai, the facilitator, provided an overview of JUST and the Peace Project before introducing the concept of local resource mobilization. Participants were then divided into four groups to identify and present local resources for potential income generation. The practical Session was followed by Surf and Phenyl making included a hands-on demonstration of surf-making, led by the JUST Team. Participants learned about the required ingredients and the process, equipping them with practical skills for income generation.
