**Warmth of December**

Despite a fall in temperature, December brings with it a warmth seldom experienced in other months of the year. Quite simply, it is the showpiece month of the year for us Christians - the month when our identity and presence seem to become most visible to those around us. The season has an uncanny knack of striking a chord in the hearts of everyone, even those generally un-enamored by religion-related matters the remaining eleven months.



And for us Christians the first twenty-four days of December are perhaps the most anticipated days of the entire calendar. As Christmas gets closer, pastors and priests routinely caution congregations against the impetuous consumer madness that seems hard to resist at this time of the year.

In a place like Tripura, where Christmas is still a relatively small scale event and almost exclusively confined to the Christian community, we are at a peculiarly advantageous position to tell our largely uninformed, rarely interested and slightly confused non-Christian brethren, the true meaning of one of the most central truths of our faith.

Do we fritter away that advantage by succumbing to the universal tendency to enjoyment the season characterizes? Or by mindless indulgence in euphoric celebrations in which 'the Christ factor' does not figure at all?

It is disheartening to see how in many so called Christian areas and countries, the centrality and role of Jesus Child in the Christmas celebrations is getting minimal. If we do it that way here in Tripura, we would be dismissing him, without ever having given him a chance!

Keeping a tab on the nature of our numerous 'pre Christmas' celebrations and Christmas related events, would surely make it easier on the wallet. More importantly, we would have, perhaps unwittingly, told thousands of curious onlookers what real Christmas is all about. Merry Christmas to you dear LINK reader!

### World's largest bible factory publishes 125 millionth copy in China:

The world's largest bible factory, operated by the Amity Foundation in Nanjing, has just published its 125 millionth copy amid a surge in demand in China over the past decade. Just two years after recording its 100 millionth bible, Amity has now sold 65.7 million copies in Chinese languages and exported 59.3 million to 70 countries. ### Eucharistic Procession enthalls Tripura's Capital City

The city of Agartala witnessed an overwhelming manifestation of faith in Christ on 8<sup>th</sup> November 2014 when hordes of faithful thronged its streets and took part in the Diocese level Eucharistic Procession. The Annual Procession, predominantly a spiritual event, is aimed at deepening faith and bearing witness to Christ. It is also arguably the largest gathering of its believers in the diocese in any given year. The procession, started six years ago and organized meticulously since then by the Catholic Lay people of Tripura under the aegis of All India Catholic Union, has been improving in organizational aspects and ambience with each passing year.

This year's edition, which had for its theme "I am the Bread of life", brought together over six thousand Catholics from all parishes of the Diocese. It began at the Vivekananda Stadium in the city with a preaching and healing session in the morning. Preaching of God's Word in Bangla, English and Kokborok interspersed with scripture readings in various languages, preceded the healing session that Fr. CR Paul CSC led.

The procession route this year included some of the most important junctions and streets of the capital city. As those walking in procession sang lustily praises of the Lord, large groups of onlookers stood on either side of the road and watched with great curiosity and admiration. The congregation, consisting of the young and the old, from an array of tribes and communities, and dressed mostly in traditional attire, transformed the bustling streets of Agartala town into a riot of colour and pageantry. For the onlookers of a town that routinely keeps witnessing processions and rallies with a political hue, the Eucharistic procession and its prayerful ambience proved to be a surprise. The Blessed Sacrament was most

While addressing the gathering at the end of the Procession, Most Rev. Lumen Monteiro CSC, DD, Bishop of Agartala Diocese urged the Catholic faithful of Tripura to make daily prayer and reading of the Scriptures a custom in every family in the Diocese. Bishop Monteiro, who spoke in English, Bangla and Kokborok also emphasized on the need to foster unity in the diocese, a gift for which Christ himself prayed.
