But then there are times in our lives when we are busy and agitated and run after the wrong things in life. Are our objectives worthwhile? Here is a story by Frank Mihalic in *Tonic for the Heart* which explains our situation: In a little country community, a farmer had a dog that spent part of his time sitting by the side of a large highway waiting for big red trucks. Whenever the dog saw a truck come round the corner, he would get ready, and as it passed him, he would take off after it down the road. One day the farmer's neighbour said, "Sam do you think that hound of yours is ever going to catch a truck?" "Well Bill" Sam replied, "That isn't what worries me. What does worry me is what he would do if he caught one!"

The problem with many of us is that we run wildly after things we could not use if we caught them. Unfortunately, sometimes we are passionate about the wrong things in life and go after them!

**Editorial**

**On this house, Your blessing Lord!**

By the time you get to read this, Easter would be over, probably. Which means its Easter time now! And one of the activities most pastors and co-pastors are busy with during this time of the liturgical year is the annual blessing of families. Blessing of a family, we are told, is the symbol of the family's renewal in Christ. *The Christmas season, especially the feast of the Epiphany, and the Easter season are traditional times when homes are blessed. While the structure of the rite and its chief elements are always to be maintained, 'the Catholic Book of Blessings' permits the minister to so select the individual parts of the rite in such a way that the celebration is better adapted to the season and the other circumstances.* The indigenous communities of Tripura are not unfamiliar with 'home cleansing' ceremonies conducted in homes in the belief that they purify homes of defilements. They



focus mainly on a set of rituals, which they believe ward off evil power and restore purity to the home.

The annual blessing of families for us Christians is centered on the Lordship of Jesus over our hearths and homes. It's a ritual through which we annually renew our selves, homes and everything we possess in Christ, the Lord of life and creation.

When the Book of Blessings insists that a home should not be blessed unless those who live in it are present, it's perhaps trying to tell us about the 'renewal' dimension of the rite.

In this season of house blessings we would do well to take cognizance of the favorable disposition our people have towards the practice and ensure they do not get reduced to mere 'purification' ceremonies but become a faith-strengthening exercise that revitalizes and renews their commitment to the Lord as a family.

There is also a need to be cautious about distractions that easily come at house blessings the tendency to reduce it to a social get-together centered on food and other unimportant matters.

## Nun's rape condemned with silent march

The Diocese of Agartala organized a silent candle light rally on 20<sup>th</sup> March 2015, at 5pm from North Gate (Vivekananda Stadium) to Circuit



House, condemning the brutal rape of a nun at

Ranaghat, West Bengal. Earlier Bishop Lumen had expressed his grief and condemned the incident: "I, as head of the Catholic Church in Tripura and on behalf of all people of goodwill, condemn the heinous crime against 72 year old Sr. Gladys, the desecration of consecrated hosts, and ruthless incidents at Ranaghat School against the Jesus Mary Sisters. I ask the Chief Minister of West Bengal to take appropriate measures to bring the perpetrators to justice and provide adequate protection to the Sisters and other religious institutions." Around 300 faithful from the town Parishes of the

Diocese took active part and the Women Religious led the silent march. Fr. Cyprian SVD, gave an introductory speech expressing the pain inflicted to a consecrated woman. Fr. Sunny SDB and Sr. Isabella BS offered prayers for the victim of this heartrending tragedy. Fr. Harry CSC articulated his gratitude to all who collaborated for its success. *News desk*

## Tripura's first Catholic Hospital Inaugurated

Agartala, 19 March 2015: Health Care services in the northeastern state of Tripura got a much-needed impetus with the inauguration of St. Joseph Hospital at the capital city of Agartala on 19<sup>th</sup> March 2015. Shri Pabitra Kar, the Local MLA and Deputy Speaker of the Tripura Legislative Assembly inaugurated the Hospital and called it a 'boon for the people of Tripura'. Built, managed and owned by Sisters of St. Joseph of Anncy (SJA) Bhubaneswar, St. Joseph's has become the first Catholic hospital in the Northeastern state of Tripura.

The inauguration was immediately followed by blessing of the newly built hospital building by Most Rev Lumen Monteiro, CSC, DD, Bishop of Agartala. Bishop Monteiro had stood at the same spot and laid the foundation for the structure in May 2012. The plot of land on which the Hospital today stands was donated by Bishop Monteiro to the Sisters of St. Joseph of Anncy for the purpose of a hospital.

Addressing the gathering Bishop Monteiro said that St. Joseph's Hospital added 'a new dimension to the ministry of the Church' and is undoubtedly a 'welcome addition to the many developmental activities' the Church is engaged in. He called it a red-letter day in the annals of the Catholic Church in Tripura, a day on which its much awaited dream became a reality. He hoped the


Hospital that began in a humble manner would grow and become an institution whose contribution will bring about significant improvements in the lives of the people of Tripura.

Shri Tapan Chakrabarty, Minister for Education, Government of Tripura, thanked and congratulated those who have taken this wonderful and immensely relevant initiative and wished it all success. He was all praise for the work of the missionaries in the State of Tripura.

Sr. Linette, the Provincial Superior of the Sisters of St Joseph of Anncy, Bhubaneswar Province said they hope to provide 'quality patient-centred health care at affordable rates' at St Joseph Hospital.

The Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Anncy had its origin in France and came to India in 1849 with the noble mission of providing education, health care and social service to everyone, especially to the poor and disadvantaged sections of the society. They run hospitals and dispensaries in a number of places in urban and rural India. They arrived in Tripura in 2010 in response to the invitation of Bishop Lumen Monteiro, CSC. Ever since preparations have been afoot for the start of the Hospital.

Sr. Linette expressed happiness at being able to collaborate with the Government and other NGOs and private Hospitals in the State to provide better health care facilities to the people. The services made available at St. Joseph Hospital will be guided by highest professional and ethical standards and also make health care cost-effective and accessible to all, she assured. The Hospital is dedicated to the people of Tripura. At the moment the following facilities will be available at St. Joseph Hospital: Critical Care Unit (Casualty), Out-Patient Department (OPD), General Medicine, General Surgery, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Laboratory (Pathology, Hematology, Biochemistry), and Holistic Nursing Care. *Spokesperson J.
