# Editorial




The announcement by our Bishop that we would soon have five more Parishes in the Diocese feels like music


presentation and Questions. The pandemic has made us to opt for a new normal and in this new normal period we have found more c o m p l e x problems

who attended the Camp were suffering due to lack of proper drinking water facilities. People were diagnosed with various common but seriously neglected problems such as acute fever, gastric, diarrhea and mal-nourishment. All the children were provided with medicines and vitamin

tonics and those suffering from diarrhea were given ORS.

## Networking and Advocacy for reasonable market rates

Training on Market Assessment was conducted at JUST Training Hall on 14th October 2020 for the SHGGroups and Farmers Clubs. The Resource Person was Mr. Sandip Bondhupaddhyai, a successful entrepreneur. There were 44 participants from the SHG Groups and Farmers Clubs in the training. He shared and encouraged the Farmers to do livestock rearing for sustainability of their income especially

# World Youth Day Cross given to Portuguese Youth

Pope Francis offered Mass for the Feast of Christ the King on Sunday, and afterward oversaw the traditional passing of the World Youth Day Cross and Marian icon to a delegation from Portugal. The event took place ahead of the 16th International World Youth Day, to be held in Lisbon, Portugal, in August 2023. The simple wooden cross was given to Youth by St. Pope John Paul II in 1984, at the end of the Holy Year of Redemption. He told young people to "carry it throughout the world as a symbol of Christ's love for humanity, and proclaim to everyone that it is only in Christ, who died and rose from the dead, that salvation and redemption are to be found."

Over the past 36 years, the Cross has traveled around the world, carried by young people on pilgrimages and processions, as well as to every international World Youth Day. The 12 and a half foot tall Cross is known by different names, including the Youth Cross, Jubilee Cross, and Pilgrim Cross. Pope Francis also announced Nov. 22 that he had decided to move the annual diocesan-level Youth day celebration from Palm Sunday to Christ the King Sunday, beginning next year. Hannah Brockhaus CNA

# Inauguration of Tree and Nativity scene in St. Peter's Squar

The traditional inauguration of the Nativity Scene and the lighted Christmas tree will be held, despite the COVID-19 limitations, in Saint Peter's Square on December 11, at 4:30 pm. Given the circumstances the world is experiencing due to the pandemic, this year's Christmas decoration is intended to be "a sign of hope and trust" and an expression of the "certainty that Jesus comes among His people to save them."

The Nativity Scene, which will be set up in Saint Peter's Square, comes from Castelli, in the Italian Province of Teramo, an important ceramics center since the 16<sup>th</sup> century.

**The Christmas Tree, the red fir tree is 289 meters tall and 70** centimeters in diameter. It comes from the Municipality of Kocevje in South-eastern Slovenia. This region is one of the Slovenian territories where nature is most intact, taking into account that the forests cover 90% of its territory.

The Tree and the Nativity Scene will be displayed in the Square until the end of Christmastide, which coincides with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, Sunday, January 10, 2021. Zenit News

### **Our Readers Write**

#### Dear Bishop Lumen,

This short reflection is occasioned by the news item in "LINK" about the "Deanery level" meetings of priests. I am writing this note to congratulate you for taking yet another very useful and relevant initiative. The Church, concerned with the welfare of the faithful and the effective functioning of pastoral care system, has devised and provided various pastoral structures. One of them is the establishment of Deaneries/Vicariates, namely, grouping together a number of Parishes as a Zone or Block. The purpose of this arrangement is to assist the Bishop in the pastoral administration of the Diocese... In order to govern the Diocese effectively, the Bishop may need 'deans' or 'vicars forane' to ensure that the parishes are functioning properly, and the spiritual and pastoral needs of the priests are taken care of. In areas where there are many Catholics stretched over a large area (like in Agartala Diocese), Deaneries are an effective tool that help the Bishop maintain unity among his flock.

In the context of the emerging concepts of participatory Church,

principle of subsidiarity, delegated authority and shared responsibilities, diversification of ministries, ethno-linguistic diversity, and increase in number of Parishes which are quite far apart from the diocesan centre, it is highly advisable that every Diocese follows the Deanery/Vicariate system. In the Dioceses of NE India, this may be a very pastorally effective approach. The Covid-19 situation which prevents frequent and large gathering of Church personnel makes such an arrangement almost a pastoral necessity.
